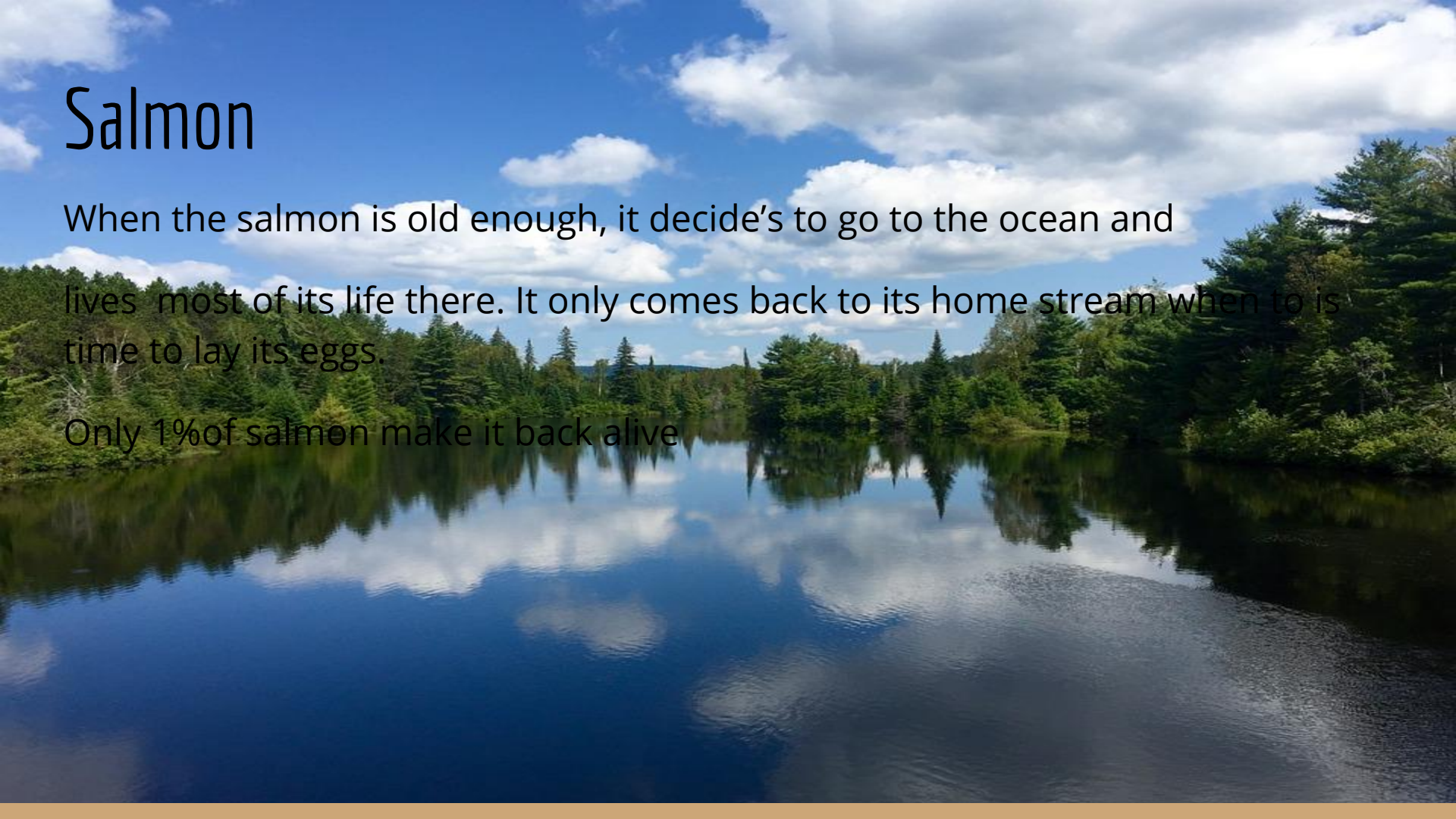
Pollution is killing a lot of our fish and it is really bad for us
